**PRINCIPAL'S REPORT** As we have discussed at our PTG meetings this summer, the financial situation remains challenging. As we deal with the various obstacles, my goal is to continue pursuing all available resources necessary for YVS to remain an outstanding K-8 school.

Having said that we have some definite challenges facing us as we begin the school year...

At this time the School District is in negotiations with Park Service as it seems that there is some conflict about last year's funding. The Park Service is holding that the money spent by MCUSD in the 2010-11 school year for the park schools was not available to be spent and therefore will not be reimbursed. This means that MCUSD is "in the hole" to the tune of approximately \$250,000.

At last Thursday's MCUSD Board meeting it was approved to move forward with the park schools funding in place for this year in hopes that this issue will be cleared-up soon and the park money be reinstated. If that does not happen however, a new plan will be put in place at the semester which would certainly include a down-grading of services provided at these schools.

This was already going to be a challenging year considering that we are funding a teaching position from left over park-grant monies that we are confident we will not have next year...

It is the deepest hope of the staff at YVS that we can all pull together to meet these challenges and raise the funds needed to keep our school afloat and the first step to that end is becoming involved in the Parent-Teacher-Group we hope you will join us.

**VOLUNTEER FINGERPRINTING** As parents you – no doubt – applaud the lengths we go to protect your child, as someone who would like to volunteer in classroom or on fieldtrips you will probably find this a bit distressing.

Fact of the matter is, if you are planning to spend much time in classroom or attending any field trips you will need to be fingerprinted for the school district. The only exception is if you have been fingerprinted by MCUSD for another school site.

Please contact the office so we can walk you through the process which begins with you bringing in a copy of a "cleared" TB test. This can be done at the clinic or there is a free clinic in Mariposa...these expire every 3 years.

## **JUST ONE REASON WHY WE NEED VOLUNTEERS**

Most of the fieldtrips we take are "overnighters" it is just too much for students to go just about anywhere from here in a day. And we cannot take any adults on a field trip who have not been fingerprinted – and this does take some time. We also often call on parents to help with the driving...this too requires fingerprinting (as well as a certain level of insurance and copy of driver's license – more about that later). So please consider getting the clearance we need so when we plan for these activities we are sure to be covered, you never know when we might want to enhance students' learning experience with a field trip.

## **ONE MORE NOTE ABOUT**

**VOLUNTEER DRIVERS** At this point there are no solid plans for a "driving" field trip however, when this happens... and it will, it is a whole new ballgame. All who received H-6 clearance last year, thank you, however that is no longer valid and should you wish to drive this year (and we hope you will) you would need to get another H-6, however, once done you may sign up for the DMV pull notice program which allows the DMV to notify the school district of any driving citations you may receive therefore allowing the district to have an ongoing opportunity to make decisions about who is allowed to safely drive our students.

**TOYS IN SCHOOL** Just a reminder: we are asking for your help in having toys remain at home or at daycare. We have a wonderful playground structure and different kinds of balls for the students to enjoy during recess-not to mention, good old imaginative play. Toys from home can interfere with valuable instructional time when they are lost or not put away at the correct time. We appreciate your assistance in this matter.

## **OUR "LANDLORDS" ARE BAAAACK**

Not that we can forget where we live, but sometimes we need a reminder. So here is our annual notice that the deer are back! In the fall our field becomes a favorite spot for rutting males and while that is quite a show for us the fact is that the deer are everywhere...
