YVS BROILER ROOM INCIDENT At about 10 pm on Sunday night residents near the school were shocked to hear what sounded like a giant rock or tree falling. The boom brought everyone out of their houses to see that the school fire alarms were all going off. After an inspection inside by the rangers and volunteer fire people no damage was detected inside the school. It was then that a ranger saw the vent to the broiler room lying on the cement patio and it was discovered that the broiler room door was ajar. Upon opening the door we saw the venting pipe lying askew in the doorway. Park Service and DNC utilities people examined the boiler and then turned off all power and gas until the system could be checked more thoroughly. The theory is that a gas leak built up fumes in the boiler room and they were ignited in an explosion that blew the vent off, popped the roof up and pushed the outside wall out. Luckily the school building is protected by cement fire walls and so the office and room one were not damaged. District crews are replacing gas lines and thoroughly checking the boiler before getting our heating system back on line. Hopefully this will not take too long—we will hold school as long as we can keep the inside temperatures warm enough (above 50°).

DISTRICT BENCHMARKS TESTS

This week YVS students will take district made benchmark tests in Language Arts and Math. The tests are designed to give teachers information about which CA state standards have been mastered by students. Because this is the first year the tests will be administered the results of the tests will be correlated with the STAR test results to see if the benchmarks are good predictors of student achievement. It will be interesting to see if YVS student benchmark scores predict their level of achievement on the STAR tests. STAR tests are given in April 2011 and results are available in August. At that time the benchmark tests will be evaluated to see if they are good predictors of student achievement.
